

How is wood recycled?

Sustainable Recycling

Wood recycling step-by-step.



Step 1: Collection

We'll collect your wood (anything from a pallet to a lorry load) and transport it back to our recycling facility.

Step 2: Grading

Once there, we'll separate your wood into grades. Grade A refers to "clean" wood, free from contaminants (such as pallets and packaging). Grade C refers to fuel grade wood, which has been treated and is contaminated (e.g. fencing products and flatpack furniture).

NB: We only collect grades A and C.

Step 3: Grade A wood

Grade A wood will then be sent to a reprocessing plant, where it will be shredded into chippings, ready to be recycled into the likes of chipboard and MDF, which are used to make new wood products or animal bedding.

Step 4: Grade C wood

Meanwhile, grade C wood will be sent to a biomass plant, where it will be converted into biomass fuel – a renewable, carbon neutral form of electricity.
